Susan Tate Ankeny



Susan Tate Ankeny left a career in teaching to research and write about her father's escape from Nazi-occupied France, resulting in the 2020 publication of The Girl and the Bombardier: A True Story of Resistance and Rescue in Nazi-Occupied France. Susan's newly released book, *American Flygirl*, is the untold account of a spirited fighter and an indomitable hidden figure in American history. She broke through every common belief about women. She challenged every social restriction to endure and to succeed. And against seemingly insurmountable obstacles, Hazel Ying Lee reached for the skies and made her mark as a universal and unsung hero whose time has come.

Susan Tate Ankeny is the great-granddaughter of Oregon pioneers and lives in the Pacific Northwest. She is a member of the Oregon Chapter of the 8th Air Force Historical Society and the Association des Sauveteurs d'Aviateurs Alliés, which finds and memorializes World War II crash sites in France.

Girls Build currently empowers girls in Southern Oregon, Portland, and the Oregon Coast.

Girls Build Programs:

Girls Build offers programming for girls teaching the basics of carpentry, electrical, plumbing, roofing, painting, auto and bike mechanics, sheet metal and more via summer camps (8–15-year-olds) and afterschool workshops.

Girls Build Impact:

Growing and growing! From the first year of 60 girls to now close to 500 a summer, Girls Build continues teaching and building confidence! Expanding from Summer Camps to after-school programming at the warehouse, Girls Build will continue educating girls all year long.

3,200+ Girls Learning to Build – Since 2016 Girls Build has taught over 3,200 girls through summer camp and after school programming.

735+ Scholarships Awarded – Because of the generosity of donors Girls Build has been able to award over 735 partial or full scholarships.

125+ Foster Care Kids – Through the foster care program, over 80 foster care kids have attended camp for FREE!

Financial Donations:

\$1,000 is the real cost of sending one child through camp.

\$500 serves the foster care program, providing a full scholarship for one foster child at camp.

\$250 covers the safety gear for 20 girls at summer camp.
